

Information on the processing of personal data in connection with the organization of the 6th Congress of Polish Statistics (Warsaw, July 1-2, 2026)

I. Controller The Controller of your personal data is the President of Statistics Poland (GUS) with the registered office at 208 Niepodległości Avenue, 00-925 Warsaw.

III. Purposes and legal basis of personal data processing Personal data will be processed for the following purposes:

- 1) **organisation of the event**, including sending invitations, registration, ongoing communication and support, providing materials related to the Congress, as well as documenting the course of the event, including by taking photographs and making audiovisual recordings for the Controller's documentation and archival purposes. The legal basis for the processing is Article 6(1)(e) of the GDPR, i.e. processing necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest, and Article 6(1)(c) of the GDPR, i.e. compliance with a legal obligation, in connection with the tasks of the President of Statistics Poland specified in Article 25(1)(16) and (17) of the Act of 29 June 1995 on Official Statistics (Journal of Laws of 2024, item 1799, as amended) in particular in the field of promoting knowledge of statistics and conducting training, further education and professional development in the field of statistics;
- 2) **archiving of documentation**: the legal basis for the processing is Article 6(1)(c) of the GDPR, i.e. compliance with a legal obligation arising from the provisions of the Act of 14 July 1983 on the National Archival Resource and Archives;
- 3) **ensuring accessibility** (architectural, information and communication, or digital accessibility) for participants reporting specific needs related to disability. The legal basis for the processing of personal data is Article 6(1)(c) of the GDPR, i.e. compliance with a legal obligation arising from the provisions of the Act of 19 July 2019 on Ensuring Accessibility for Persons with Special Needs, and Article 9(2)(b) of the GDPR.

Rules governing the dissemination of image:

Participation in the Congress involves the processing of personal data in the form of the participant's image, including its dissemination. An image recorded as part of the overall visual record documenting the course of the event may be disseminated in connection with:

- the broadcasting of the event on the YouTube channel;
- the publication of photographs and recordings on the Statistics Poland website and on the official Statistics Poland social media profiles.

The legal basis for the processing of such data is Article 6(1)(e) of the GDPR, i.e. processing necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest, in conjunction with Article 25(1)(16) and (17) of the Act on Official Statistics, as well as Article 81(2) of the Act of 4 February 1994 on Copyright and Related Rights.

IV. Recipients of personal data Personal data may be disclosed to service providers used by the Controller in the course of its activities or to entities specified by law (e.g. IT and organisational service providers). Depending on the contractual arrangements and circumstances, service providers to whom the Controller discloses personal data either act on the Controller's instructions as to the purposes and means of processing such data (processors), or independently determine the purposes and means of their processing (separate controllers).

With regard to the dissemination of image on the Internet, intranet and the Controller's social media platforms, recipients of the data also include Facebook, X

(formerly Twitter), Instagram and LinkedIn. These social media platforms have their own policies regarding the methods and purposes of processing and protecting personal data:

V. Period of storage of personal data	Personal data will be stored in connection with the purposes of their processing referred to in Section III, i.e. for the period during which the law requires the Controller to retain the data, including the periods specified for the respective archival categories assigned to the individual archival documentation held by the Controller.
VI. Rights of the data subject	<p>Under the terms and within the scope specified in the GDPR, you have the right to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• request access to your personal data;• request rectification of your personal data;• request erasure of your personal data;• request restriction of processing;• object to the processing of your personal data. <p>If you consider that the processing of personal data infringes the provisions of the GDPR, you are informed of the possibility to lodge a complaint with the President of the Personal Data Protection Office.</p>
VII. Voluntariness of providing personal data	Providing personal data is voluntary, but necessary in order to participate in the Congress. Failure to provide the data will make registration and participation in the event impossible.
VIII. Automated decision-making, including profiling	Your personal data will not be profiled or subject to automated decision-making.
IX. Transfer of data outside the EEA	The Controller does not plan to transfer personal data to a third country or an international organisation. However, in connection with the dissemination of the course of the Congress via the Controller's official social media accounts, including Facebook, X, Instagram and LinkedIn, those platforms may transfer personal data to entities outside the EEA.
